### WE'RE BACK!!!

At the end of April, we arrived back in Arequipa, Peru to begin our second term with Mission to the World. It was a blessing to visit all of our partner churches and see friends and family, but after 4.5 months in the U.S., we are very glad to be back “home”—in our own beds, attending our own church, serving in our own community, and trying to find the elusive “family routine.” There has certainly been no rest for the weary as we have hit the ground running. To be honest, it was nice to be able to preach in English while we were in the U.S., but we are thankful that our Spanish did not become too rusty during our time away. We are already back in the saddle: preaching, teaching, counseling, visitations, studying, and just living.

No, that is not the price of some gimmick on an infomercial. This is a reminder of God’s faithfulness to us. Soon after our arrival in the U.S., we were handed a glass jar that held \$19.95 in dollar bills, quarters, dimes, nickels, and pennies. The children of some close friends had held a cookie sale in their driveway, but instead of choosing to spend the money on a toy, they told their mom they wanted to send the money to help their missionaries in Peru. We were so humbled that these kids would work so hard and give up their time to be a part of the Mission. Inviting people to come alongside of our ministry and support us financially is certainly the most humbling (and sometimes awkward) part of this calling, but this is just one example of how the Lord has used our ministry partners in the U.S. to encourage us and to confirm the call that the Lord has placed on us to serve the people of Peru. God’s faithfulness was shown to us time and time again through you, our ministry partners who support us through your prayers and financial giving.



### AN APOLOGY

As we were planning for our “Home Ministry Assignment” (HMA, furlough, etc.), we had grandiose plans of visiting all of our partner churches and meeting with every one of those individuals who have come alongside of us to support the ministry in Peru. Wow, did we overestimate how much we could do in just a few months!!! Between travelling around to visit our partner churches (16 churches in 19 weeks), we also had to cram in four years’ worth of medical appointments, a debrief conference with MTW, a recruiting conference

(to try to grow our team), several Bible study presentations and ministry meetings, and spend time with family and friends. One family member said it best when they told us, “I hardly get to see you! You might as well still be in Peru.” On top of this, trying to assist with ministry in Arequipa, keep up with the administrative aspects of the job, and continue “normal” family responsibilities proved to be challenging. To put it bluntly, we were not able to visit with everyone that we wanted to, and for that we sincerely apologize. There are several of you who support us faithfully and we truly wanted to catch up over coffee or a meal... it just didn’t happen. ***Please, forgive us for this.*** It does truly make us feel terrible that we couldn’t see everybody.

- 4. Pray for our fund-raising.** We were able to share the work in Arequipa with several new individuals and a couple of new churches. Pray that, if it should be the Lord’s will, they would partner with us.
